GVPT B.S. Major Benchmarks

Benchmark Requirements: In accordance with University policy, the Department of Government and Politics has established benchmark requirements. Students are expected to demonstrate continuing progress in their majors by completing prerequisite or required courses with the appropriate grades within an established timeframe. Students who do not complete benchmark requirements will need to choose a new major and will not be permitted to return to the Government and Politics major at a later time.

Benchmark 1: Students must complete the following four courses within two semesters of entering the major:

- ☐ GVPT170 with a grade of C- or higher
- ☐ GVPT201 with a grade of C- or higher
- ☐ One of STAT100⁺, MATH 107,113,115,120,135,136, **or** 140 with a grade of C- or higher
- ☐ Academic Writing with a grade of C- or higher

*STAT100 preferred

Benchmark 2: Students must complete the following course within one semester of completing Benchmark 1:

☐ GVPT320 with a grade of C- or higher
