She is now a professor at The New School in New York and author of a new book, *In Putin's Footsteps: Searching for the Soul of An Empire across Russia's Eleven Time Zones*.

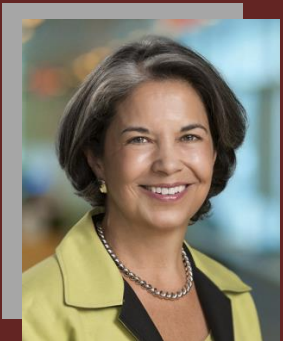
### **Wallace Loh**

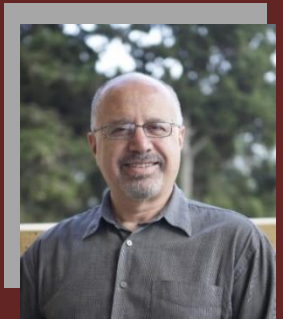
### **Abderrahim Foukara**
